Real-World Learning

On September 29, Ms. Jovic's and Ms. To's STEAM elective course students traveled to Oak Point University (formerly Resurrection University) at Presence Saint Elizabeth's Hospital. Our students got a



tour of the Foglia Family Foundation IPE Simulation Learning Center, where nursing students are trained through the university. Our students participated in a handwashing germ activity and worked with some of the simulated patients (manikins) relaying data to monitors. The takeaway was that the setting and manikins were a great realistic way to engage in learning scenarios!
