Our Physical Education Department was excited when the IHSA opened up sports again in 2021!


It was wonderful to offer our students the opportunity to play volleyball, soccer, and softball.

Foreign Language Department Update from Ms. Cruz

Our Freshmen in Spanish class created a seasonal tree during a weather unit (El Clima.) It was a hands-on crafts project. They needed to decorate and include vocabulary in the targeted language, Spanish, to describe the weather during the 4 seasons. It was great seeing the final results and how creative each student was.

Our Freshmen in French conducted a research project: Une région de l'Hexagone. Each student had to research





a region of France and present basic information in French using objectives covered in class. Students presented their research on the languages/patois spoken in the region, the basic geographical features, the geographical location, the climate during the seasons, and stated a brief opinion about the region. Students presented excellent projects and were able to use the French they had learned in a presentational context.

All Seniors hosted a conversation in the targeted language of Spanish or French for 12 to 15 minutes. Students got a picture and had to talk about it for 3-5 minutes, followed up with a conversation with the teacher about the picture's theme. Students finished the conversation talking about another topic covered during the year. All students did great and were able to truly showcase their Spanish/French skills!



Humanities Department Update from Ms. Knapczyk

We examined women and power, both during the Salem Witch Trials and present day. We examined how female power in the past was looked at as "witchcraft" and in present day, the word "witch" is still used to negatively describe a woman.

Students also researched Indigenous People's tribes and gave presentations.

History Department Update from Mr. Popovski

Students studied the psychology of genocide. We read psychological studies about why ordinary people commit genocide, "the deliberate killing of a large number of people from a particular nation or ethnic group with the aim of destroying that nation or group." We used these studies with the context of the Rwandan genocide, and there were some pretty interesting discussions on fair punishment and human behavior.

For our Historical Investigation Unit, the students got to choose their own topics. They had to be at least 10 years ago. Each student then researched the topics, analyzed sources related to them, and projected their viewpoints in an essay.

Graduation 2021

On Saturday, June 5, the thirty-seven young women of the Josephinum Academy of the Sacred Heart Class of 2021 graduated in an in-person, outdoor ceremony on the Josephinum field. The commencement address was delivered by Science teacher Olivia Johnson and inspiring speeches were given by this year's six co-valedictorians. This graduating class faced challenges like no other in Josephinum's history and we are so very proud of their resilience and their accomplishments.

Class of 2021 graduates will be continuing their education at schools such as Cornell University, DePaul University, Howard University, Northwestern University, Notre Dame University, Purdue University and University of Illinois (Chicago and Urbana Champaign). Several graduates



are taking part in the Star Scholarship Program, beginning their college journeys at City Colleges of Chicago.

The young women of the Class of 2021, including three Illinois State Scholars, were awarded a total of over \$6.7M in merit scholarships. The entire Jo community wishes them all great success in their future endeavors and looks forward to hearing where their journeys take them.
