

THE JO'S NEW PRINCIPAL

WE ARE EXCITED TO WELCOME OUR NEW PRINCIPAL, COLLEEN SCHRANTZ and introduce her to our Josephinum community. Ms. Schrantz assumed her role as principal this year, succeeding Mary Rose Guerin. Ms. Guerin has accepted a position at the Forest Ridge Academy of the Sacred Heart in Seattle, Washington.

Ms. Schrantz joined “the Jo” as assistant principal in 2018 after serving as principal of St. Bruno Catholic Elementary School in Chicago. During her tenure at St. Bruno she built a long-term strategic plan which was comprised of forming partnerships in the community, increasing enrollment, strengthening the school culture, and improving test scores. And prior to St. Bruno she taught middle school math and computer applications at St. Eugene grade school in Chicago.

We are especially proud that Ms. Schrantz was selected for Big Shoulders Fund’s prestigious “Sullivan Leaders Fellowship.” Named for Sue and Tim Sullivan (Sue Sullivan is a Josephinum Board member), the program seeks to address critical factors that heavily impact principal success and retention, and places Ms. Schrantz within a network of effective, connected, and dedicated leaders who are applying practices that are quantifiably linked to student success.

Upon entering the Jo, Ms. Schrantz immediately recognized what has made a Josephinum education so special for almost 130 years. “And since 2001, the goals and criteria of the Sacred Heart guide students in the direction of making

WHAT IS THE IB DIPLOMA PROGRAMME?

OUR IBDP CREATES ENDLESS POSSIBILITIES

The International Baccalaureate (IB) organization is a worldwide non-profit educational foundation founded in 1957 to foster open and enlightened minds through education with programs for ages 3-19. Each of these rigorous programs encourages both personal and academic achievement, challenging students to excel in their studies and personal development. The results are inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who help create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect.

WHAT IS IBDP?

Josephinum Academy is one of only three all-girls schools in the U.S. to offer a wall-to-wall International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP), and the only school in the Midwest. We join a select group of educational institutions; almost 5,000 schools in over 150 countries around the world. The IBDP aims to develop students who have an excellent breadth of knowledge. It is a skills- and aptitude-based education where students don't just learn what to think; they learn how to think.

We made the philosophical decision to go wall-to-wall to fulfill our commitment to provide a superior four-year education that is accessible and affordable to our diverse community. Unlike many schools, IB at Josephinum is not an advanced track for select students. All incoming 9th graders enter our IBDP program and begin their high school years taking courses to prepare for and succeed in the more structured 11th and 12th grade IBDP curriculum.



POINTED TOWARDS SUCCESS

Research studies with IB students have shown some key findings:

- Students are very comfortable in high school and view their peers as diverse and familial; the environment is more collaborative than competitive.
- Students view their high school's "college-going" culture and goal of higher education attainment as positive.
- Diploma Programme (DP) graduates are more likely to enroll in college and to adjust to the rigors of coursework.
- Students feel that the challenges of the DP program helped smooth the transition to college. They know how to study and have clear career aspirations.
- Students see their DP experience as a contribution to a positive academic self-concept, self-efficacy, a college identity, and their life goals.

HOW WERE YOU A "GIRL WITHOUT LIMITS?"

Because of teachers like Robert Bump and Sister Anastasia we started becoming women. They allowed us to speak our minds. They also sponsored field trips that became some of the best memories of my life. As I grew after high school, the experiences I had in high school helped me become a confident young woman.

ANY ADVICE FOR THE CURRENT STUDENTS?

Watch, listen and you WILL LEARN! Just be you 24/7 and respect others.

WHAT MADE YOU THINK OF ORGANIZING AND HOSTING THE REUNION?

I wanted to reconnect with some great ladies. I was missing REAL friends in my life and wanted to reach out to my former classmates.

HOW MANY WOMEN CAME? WHERE DID THEY COME FROM?

AN INTERVIEW WITH SHEILA AND CATHY BRENNAN

HOW DID YOU FIRST LEARN ABOUT JOSEPHINUM ACADEMY?

SHEILA: I attended a party at the home of Josephinum supporters and was introduced to the school. The hosts asked all the attendees to become involved in whatever way they could. I started attending fundraisers and eventually joined the board.

SHEILA: These young women are the future of our city and it is so very important to help them reach their potential.

HOW DO YOU SEE YOUR TIME AND MONETARY INVESTMENTS BENEFITTING THE SUCCESS OF THE JO GIRLS?

SHEILA: The scholarship program that makes it possible for these young women to attend the school is the key ingredient that helps them succeed.

CATHY: You just know that what you are doing goes directly into helping the girls succeed. The Board and committees all work really hard for this one common goal.

WHAT ARE YOUR THOUGHTS ABOUT AN ALL-GIRLS EDUCATION AND THE SACRED HEART VALUES?

CATHY: Young women thrive when they are in an environment where they feel comfortable, confident and well supported.

SHEILA: It is important that an all-girls education is an option for all young women.

WHAT DOES BEING A “GIRL WITHOUT LIMITS” MEAN TO YOU?

CATHY: It is a girl that feels strong, confident and well equipped to go out into the world and do whatever it is she sets her mind to do.

SHEILA: If you believe in yourself and have love and support around you, you can succeed.
